Since the Rehabilitation Center began treating individuals with traumatic and acquired brain injury over 45 years ago, thousands of adults, adolescents and children, along with their families, have trusted us with their care. Each year approximately 160-165 people receive inpatient rehabilitation in a specialized, 38-bed unit dedicated to brain injury care. Caring for such a high number of people with a similar diagnosis enhances the experience of patients and families and advances the knowledge and expertise of our medical teams.

Because every brain injury, like the person who sustains it, is unique we direct the full resources of our capabilities, our four decades of experience and our highly skilled, multidisciplinary team toward a completely individualized rehabilitation program for each patient. We also make sure that the rehab and recovery program is flexible enough to adapt to changing conditions during the process.

What is Measured

Discharge to Community – the percentage of individuals with brain injury who return to the community (rather than to another care facility) following rehab.

Why it Matters

Returning to the community is one of the most important goals of brain injury rehab and is a strong indicator that the individual experienced improved functional outcomes during inpatient rehabilitation.

What You Can Count On

If you or someone close to you has a brain injury you can count on treatment that meets your specific rehabilitation needs and post-rehab goals. Getting you back to your life with as much function, independence and quality as possible is our primary objective.
